OPENING MEDITATION AND PRAYER

REPORT FROM SAFETY AND SECURITY TEAM

Gloria Bennett, Ann Blackwood, Robin Chambers and Jax Collins attended the Foothills
 Presbytery Church Safety and Security workshop September 14. They
 presented their report to Session with discussion on several issues.

Team was seconded and carried. They will organize a plan for NACCP and make

suggestions for implementation. Robin Chambers will lead this team.

REPORT FROM THE CLERK

◆ The next Foothills Presbytery meeting is Nov 12, 10 - 2:30, at John Knox Presbyterian
Church in Greenville. By consensus of Session, Elder Blackwood will represent NACCP

as the commissioner at this meeting.

- Sharon and Karen met with Rebecca Hines a few weeks ago regarding her use of the labyrinth. Several concerns came from discussion liability insurance, in-kind donation, facility's agreement, a concrete plan for using the space. We will wait to hear more from Rebecca before making a final decision.
- PFLAG has requested use of the building, parking lot, stage and labyrinth to have a safe space for a Halloween celebration for children Oct 18. They will need to sign the Facility Agreement. Sarah Shumpert will be in attendance. A motion by Elder Blackwood to allow PFLAG to use the building and outdoor spaces was seconded and carried.

REPORT FROM WORSHIP LEADER

• Keith has been asked to perform the marriage of Chris Hall and Patrick Brumfield at NACCP Nov 9, 3 pm. A motion by Elder Shumpert to approve the use of the church building for this marriage ceremony was seconded and carried.

- Building and Grounds report:
- ♦ Floors & Drainage. We have consensus that poor drainage contributes to the "oozing" problem we have with our new floor. The worst "oozing" is in the sanctuary and we know that the area under our sanctuary is the most poorly drained section of our property. Gloria is preparing a job description for the work we need done to improve drainage and we will use it to get three bids for the work.
- Grant Funds. Manella learned about grant funding that could help us correct our

drainage problem. On 3 September, she convened a small group (Tom, Gloria and Joanne) to consider how to prepare an application for this funding. Our application would require approval by Foothills Presbytery and would be due on 31 December.

- ♦ Rooms. Thanks to Manella and Joanne for adding signs and exit plans to each of our rooms. Thanks to Cynthia, Etta and Joanne for making our linens more accessible. We have two racks of costumes and one rack of linens in Meeting Room 2.
- ♦ Cleanup. As we prepared for our first outdoor worship since May, we learned that a tree had fallen across our outdoor seating area. A handful of hard-working folks (I still am not sure who!) cut the tree up and cleared the area so our service could proceed as usual. In the wake of Hurricane Helene some large limbs fell onto our driveway; thanks to Manella and Dupre for clearing the driveway.
- ♦ Mulching. Our committee wants to improve, through better leaf mulching, the areas within our grounds which are unmowed as they are bare soil. Covering these bare root and ground places with generous layers of leaves will facilitate break up of packed soil, improve water retention, and help control erosion. We have lots of "starting material" available as each time our parking lot is blown free of leaf litter, our needed leaf mulch appears.

- Manella handed out drafts of two suggestions for the Mary Hemphill grant Repairing the drainage problem around the church building that has affected the new flooring and adding a shower to the front bathroom. It was decided that the drainage problem is the most important issue to address. The grant is for \$6000 and the rough estimate for the drainage repair is \$7400. Tom indicated there is sufficient funds in the budget to cover the balance.
- A motion made by Elder Nelson to allow Manella to finalize the grant for the drainage repair after quotes are given was seconded and carried.

FINANCE - Tom Wright, Manella Calhoun

- Tom presented the September statement.
- Collections were more than expenses by \$4,375.
- ❖ Real Cash is \$101,029.
- The church's Zoom account will be discontinued.
- Tom has reinvested in a CD that returned approximately \$1100.
- A motion made by Elder Blackwood to increase Dr Keith Ray's COL by 10% was seconded and carried.

- Tom gave an update on several special funds that are part of the budget.
